The Parish Council meets at 7.30 pm on the third Tuesday of every month in the Village Hall. Half an hour is set aside for members of the public to ask questions or raise concerns. It would be really nice to see you at one or more of our meetings. The Council also has a new initiative to contact people via email. The Parish Council is there to help you, so please feel free to contact any of your councillors if you need to.

Parish magazine

A free monthly parish magazine, *Parish Matters*, will be delivered to your door. Always read the Piddington pages as they will help to keep you up to date with what is going on. The magazine also contains many adverts for useful local services.

Another free monthly publication, called *Bicester Villages Postal Advertiser*, is also delivered to all households. It consists entirely of adverts for local businesses.

Post boxes and public telephone

There are two post boxes in the village: one in the stone wall at the centre of the village in Lower End and another opposite the Church in Thame Road.

At present (November 2016) there is a public telephone box in the centre of the village close to the Ludgershall Road turn. However, this box is no longer functional and is scheduled for removal by BT.

Noticeboards

We have three village noticeboards: one in Lower End by the gates to the allotments, one in the centre of the village next to the telephone box and a third opposite the Church. There are also noticeboards in the porch of the Village Hall and at the Church. It is always worth checking the noticeboards to see what is going on; events outside the village are also often advertised on the village noticeboards.

Rubbish and recycling

You should have been left with a brown bin, a green bin and either a blue bin or a blue box. The brown bin is for grass cuttings, hedge clippings, weeds, small branches, leaves, pet straw/sawdust, plants and flowers, and food waste. The blue containers are for plastic bottles/containers, pamphlets/leaflets, newspapers and magazines, directories and brochures, mixed paper, card, and drinks and food cans. Any other non-recyclable household rubbish goes in the green bin. You can leave old batteries or small broken household appliances in a plastic bag on top of any of your bins, but Cherwell does not take glass, which you are encouraged to dispose of at bottle banks. The Council will only take a bin if the lid is down and they will not collect anything else put beside it. If you have a damaged bin, or if one is missing, the Council will repair or replace it free of charge. If you need an additional blue or brown bin, there is a charge of about £30.00. The bins are collected alternate weeks on a Wednesday, brown and blue bins one week, green bins the other week – please put them outside your gate. Collections can be very early, so make it a Tuesday evening routine.

If you have any bulky items, such as large appliances or broken furniture, or a large amount of waste, contact the Council on 01295 252535.

Village Hall

The Village Hall is in Ludgershall Road. It has a large car park and there is a play area with climbing frames and ropes at the back of the hall for children under the age of twelve. The Village Hall is a focal point of the village and is run by a committee of volunteers (the Piddington Village Hall Management Committee, or PVHMC). Village Hall events are publicised on village noticeboards, in *Parish Matters* and on the Piddington Village Website. Various clubs and societies use the hall regularly and it is available for private hire for all occasions – call 07922 040550 or email piddingtonvillagehall@gmail.com with enquiries or to make a booking. Pop-up pub

A pop-up pub is held in the Village Hall on the last Friday of every month from 7 pm until 11 pm. It is the ideal place to meet new people and catch up with old friends. Real ale is always available on draught and, while stocks last, so is Piddington's very own cider.

Apple Day

In October 2015, Piddington's first Apple Day was held at the Village Hall. People throughout the village brought along spare apples from their trees and then washed, chopped, scrapped (finely chopped) and pressed them to yield pure apple juice. Much of this was then fermented to produce Piddington cider, which has been available at the Village Hall's Pop-up Pubs and other events. Any remaining apples were taken away to be pasteurised and bottled. The bottles have then been sold at many village events. The second Apple Day took place in October 2016 and it is now established as an annual event, although, unfortunately, it could not take place in 2019 owing to a shortage of apples. The Pantry

A small group of villagers organise a seasonal community market and coffee shop called ‘The Pantry’ at the Village Hall. Jubilee Reserve and the Pocket Park

Just outside the village, on Widnell Lane, you will find the Jubilee Reserve, which includes Widnell Park and the playing field. This area belongs to the village and is gradually being improved by the Parish Council. It is an ideal area for walking dogs, playing ball-games or having a picnic. There are several picnic tables and a couple of benches to rest at. It is on the route of the five-mile Piddington Circular Walk. For a more restrained stroll try the Pocket Park at the end of Lower End, which has a comfortable bench for anyone wishing to admire the view.

Buses and other transport

A weekly bus to Bicester runs from the bus stop in Arccott Road every Friday. The bus leaves Piddington at 10.50 and arrives in Bicester at 11.05. It returns from Bicester at 1.20, arriving in Piddington at 1.32.

The fare is £2.50 for a single journey, £5 return. Unfortunately, it is not possible to use bus passes on this service. The buses are run by Charlton Services, 01865 331249.
