140.	<p>Minutes The Minutes of the meeting of 15th October 2018 were agreed as drawn.</p>	AD								
141.	<p>Councillor’s Report Cllr Sames reported that the big issue at both OCC and CDC was the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway, although his perception was that neither CDC nor OCC really have a view on routes design etc. However, he agreed to discuss the Parish Council’s interest at a meeting with CDC officers on 21st November. Although the Clerk has reported the street lights that are not working on the “Fix my street” website, they have not been repaired, and Mr Sames agreed to chase these.</p> <p>When asked about the state of Part 2 of CDC’s Local Plan, his view was that this would need to be subjected to a public Inquiry before the Plan is deemed to be “sound” and to do this for part of Part2 would present difficulties.</p>

There was concern at the level of dog waste on the Sports Field, and Councillors will review the campaign from the “Keep Britain Tidy” group to decide whether it is likely to be able to reduce this. 149.	<p>Emergency Plan</p> <p>The Parish Council has now paid for the wiring necessary for the generator. A shed has been identified and the Clerk was asked to make arrangements for it to be ordered and delivered to the Village Hall. It is sized 8' x10' and will be erected adjacent to the existing shed.</p>	
150.	<p>Network Rail</p> <p>Cllrs Howard and Darby have met with Network Rail, who have agreed to keep the Parish Council informed as the works proceed. However, currently there are delays with planning permission, which may delay the start of the works until late Spring.</p>	AD
