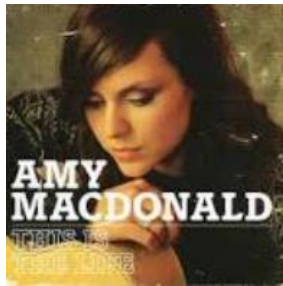


PCR Saturday @ Home

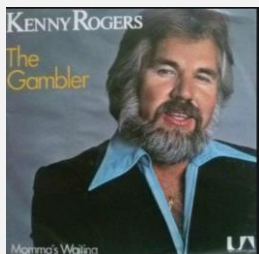
2: Paloma Faith – Do You Want the Truth or Something Beautiful

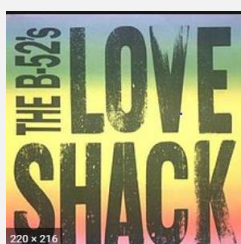
4: Kenny Rogers – The Gambler

A legend and such a great song writer, all of his songs tell a story but this is my favourite Kenny story.



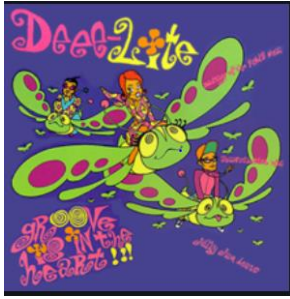
5: Katrina and the Waves – Walking on Sunshine

Reminds me of the days when I sang in the band – this was always a crowd pleaser and a foot tapper!



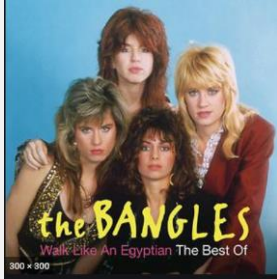
6: B52s – Love Shack

Another one we used to sing in the band which summed up my life at the time pretty well!



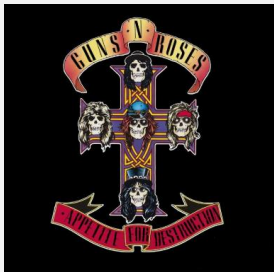
9: Duran Duran – Rio

Fun song that reminds me of being at Car Fest in 2013 when I got to hang out with the band backstage – they're great guys and brilliant performers.



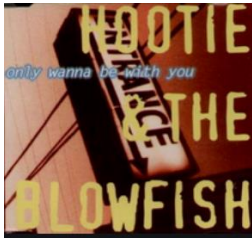
11: Guns 'n' Roses – Sweet Child O Mine

This is was my first introduction to rock and metal music, Guns 'n' Roses have a lot to answer for!



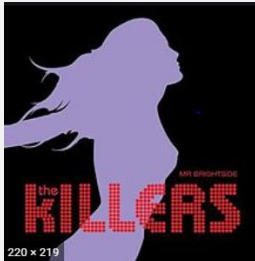
12: The Strokes – Last Night

One of my all time favourite kitchen disco songs, just great to dance to.



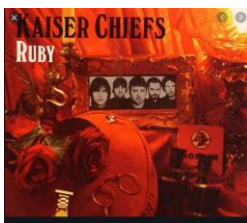
13: Hootie and The Blowfish – Only Want To Be With You

This marks a chapter in my life and reminds me of my friend Claire.



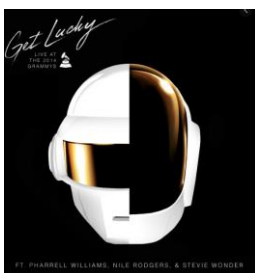
15: Kaiser Chiefs – Ruby

Girly holidays in Spain, dancing to this with Sam and Sue.



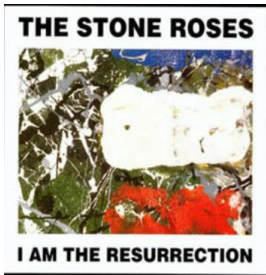
18: Pharrell Williams – Happy

Just because it makes me feel happy.



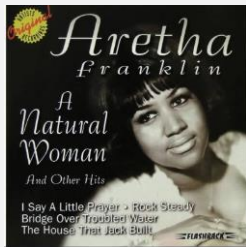
19: Reef – Place Your Hands

This reminds me of dancing like hooligans with my best friend Luigi, back in the 90s.



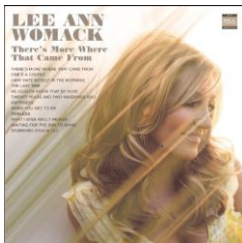
20: Stone Roses – I Am the Resurrection

This is the anthem for me and my best friend and takes me back to many a Saturday night spent in the Zodiac on the Cowley Road, Oxford.



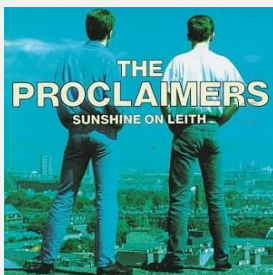
21: Aretha Franklin- Son of a Preacher Man

Love this song but the less said about why it means something to me the better!



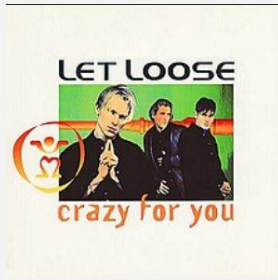
23: The Proclaimers – Sunshine on Leith

What a tune.



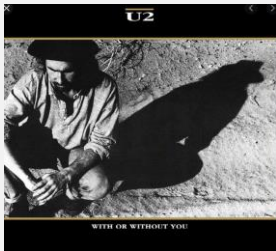
25: Let Loose – Crazy For You

I was hooked on the Commitments from the moment I saw the film. I love the way this song starts and then builds into an amazingly powerful anthem.



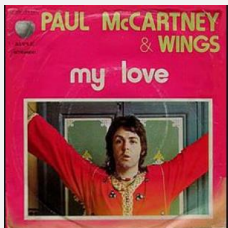
27: U2 – With or Without You
