Dusty Springfield

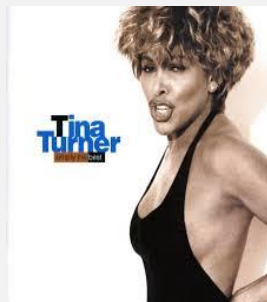
M: Dusty was one of the icons of the swinging sixties with her bouffant hair and heavy makeup. Her haunting voice was amazing.

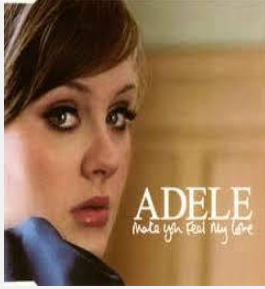


5: Summer Holiday 1963

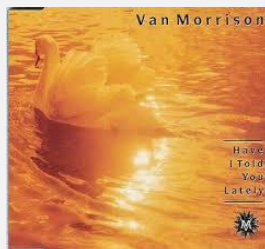
7: O Mio Babbino Caro, from the opera *Gianni Schicchi* by Puccini 1918

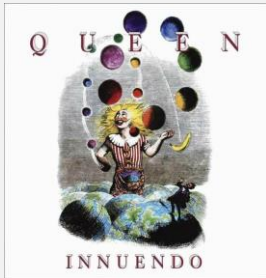

The Rolling Stones

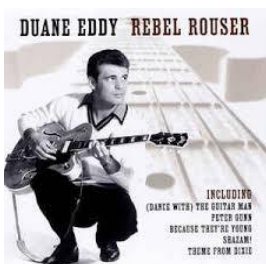
P: The B-Side of Honky Tonk Women and my favourite song of all time, end of.

The Band

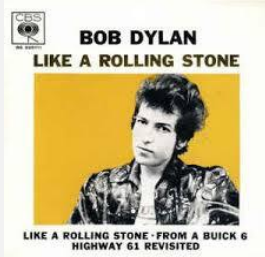
P: A great song by one of my favourite bands. Sadly, the world no longer has the voices of Levon, Richard, and Rick, but we are left with some wonderful musical memories.

P: Maybe the most groundbreaking record of all time from a songwriting genius.

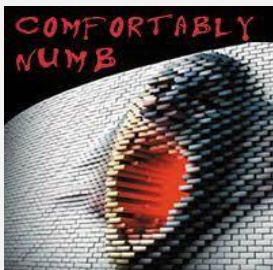

Glen Miller

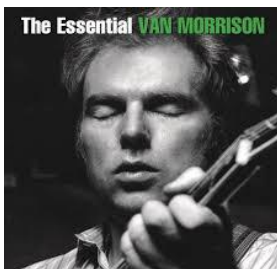
P: Brilliant piece of music that reminds me of old war films and a bygone age. Appears on so many iPod playlists of mine along with Motörhead, funnily enough.

P: I can remember where I was the first time I heard this and it blew me away. Seen them twice in concert and they were incredible.

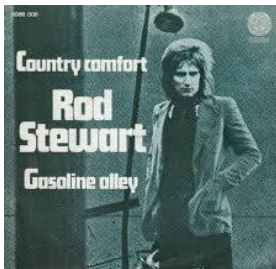
22: Tiny Dancer
