Cliff Richard

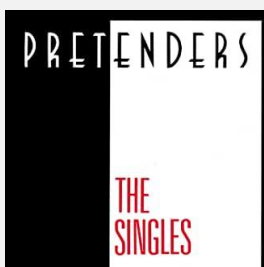
A number 2 in 1963. A lovely song from Cliff.

Pretenders

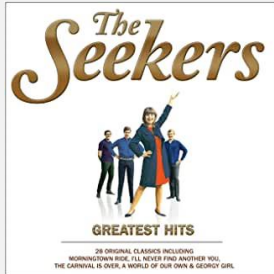
Picked this up in my later years.

16: When You Were Sweet Sixteen 4.13

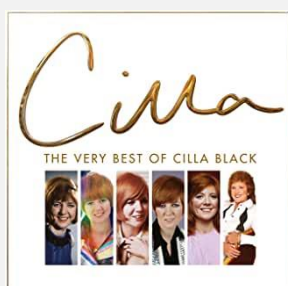
So simply sung and it makes me cry.

Cilla Black

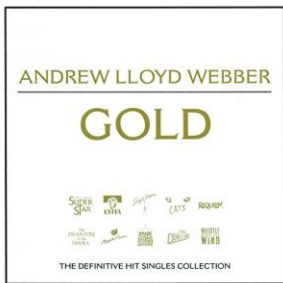
