A great song from the year Pam and I got together!



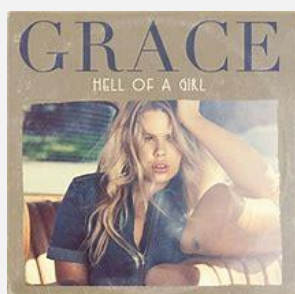
## 2: Pet Shop Boys with Dusty Springfield – What Have I Done To Deserve This – 1987

What an amazing voice.



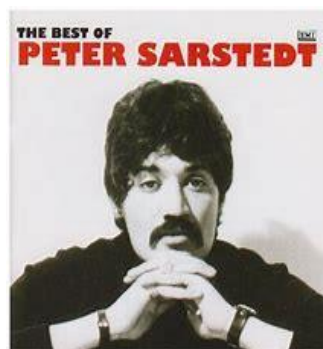
**13: Manic Street Preachers – Distant Colours – 2018**

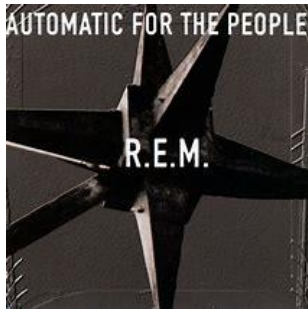
**15: Peter Sarstedt – Where Do You Go To (My Lovely) – 1969**

A real classic remembered from my teenage years.



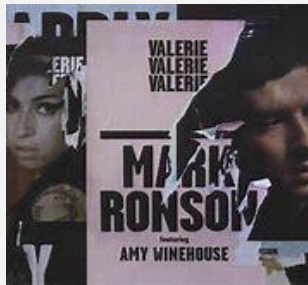
**16: Texas – Summer Son – 1999**
